


i. Energy Conservation/ Use of Solar Energy


On-grid rooftop solar plant that meets the electricity demands of the entire institution.






Various Garbage bins across the college campus













Waste-Disposal Pit




iii. Rain Water Harvesting and its use for Gardening and Cleanliness







iv. Plastic-Free Campus








v. Blood Donation Camps


